after diaghilev's death, ballets russes dancers spread out to a number of countries for 3 decades a series of companies carried on the name of ballets russe there was a struggle between rene blum and colonel de basil over who should inherit diaghilev's crown of leadership important dancers: a 3 baby ballerinas 1 irina baronova 2
