Another reason for bluebird decline is loss of habitat due to the cutting of dead trees and suppression of fire Fires are important for maintaining oak woodlands with open meadows Without fire, dense forests of fir trees can take over Raccoons and house cats may be part of the cause of bluebird decline because they prey on bluebirds

Bluebird-sized boxes can be placed in pairs, up to ten feet apart, because native birds of different species will nest side-by-side (example: Tree Swallows and Eastern Bluebirds) Nest Box Placement Tree Swallow Habitat: Open fields, meadows, marshes Placement: On a post about 5' above the ground in an open area near a tree or fence

A: Eastern Bluebird nestboxes should be spaced at intervals of at least 100 yards — 125-150 yards may be better Mountain and Western Bluebird boxes should be 200-300 yards apart If House Wrens are likely to be a problem, be sure the box is mounted at least 50-200 feet ...

Nestlings pecked on head or dead on ground below box, nest undisturbed HOUSE WREN Keep twigs removed Plug hole until wren relocates Mount wren box with 1-inch hole near shrubbery Move bluebird box 100 feet away from shrubs, trees Leave completed wren nests alone, and erect another box in the open for bluebirds
