above definitions are both representative and applicable to Woolf's and Winterson's treatment of sexuality Before addressing sexual ambiguity, the notion of unambiguous sexuality, as it is represented in these novels, must be explored In Orlando, Woolf adopts a tongue-in-cheek stance on heterosexuality, depicting it as an unavoidable default
