Wilfred Owen, having himself suffered a series of traumas on the front lines, was already at Craiglockhart when Sassoon arrived As an aspiring young poet, Owen was keen to meet Sassoon, who had recently published a volume of poems (The Old Huntsman) to some acclaim Owen had read

Sassoon's poems and knew about the "Declaration"
